<b>TITLE</b>	Control Of Traffic Flow On Work Sites
<b>GENERAL</b>	Protecting workers from injuries associated with traffic congestion on work sites
<b>APPLICATION</b>	Traffic at work sites must be regulated in such a manner to protect the safety and well being of all personnel and equipment.
<b>PROTECTIVE MECHANISMS</b>	Safe job procedure Permit system PPE Signs and barricades ERP (Emergency Response Plan)
<b>SELECTION AND USE</b>	As per job requirement
<b>SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY</b>	To facilitate and/or provide proper instruction to their workers on protection requirements and to identify potential hazards
<b>WORKER RESPONSIBILITY</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Erect signs and barricades to direct traffic safely around worksite.</li> <li>2. Restrict on site traffic.</li> <li>3. Obtain authorization to enter restricted work areas, leases or plant sites.</li> <li>4. Vehicles should park pointed towards the exit with the doors closed, unlocked and the keys in the ignition.</li> <li>5. Prior to operation, the operator must perform a walk around check of the vehicle.</li> <li>6. Operate vehicles in a safe, courteous manner.</li> </ol>
