	Determine the type of scaffold required
WORKER	1. Ensure grounding on a firm and level base.
RESPONSIBILITY	2. Maintain the established minimum clearances from all power lines.
	3. Provide a safe access ladder.
	4. Ensure scaffold has a platform perimeter handrail.
	5. Anchor or tie a <i>free standing</i> scaffold according to legislation.
	6. Do not use a ladder sloped against the side of a scaffold at any time.
	7. A toe board is required on all platforms.
	8. Ensure tube and clamp modular construction is utilized. Wood
	construction is to be used only when absolutely necessary.
	9. Ensure proper safe scaffold tags are installed.
	10. Utilize a tag line when hoisting material.
	11. Minimize tools, material and debris on the platform.
	12. Ensure a hand line with a tool bag for tools is utilized.
	13. When working at 3m (10 ft.), fall protection system must be used.
	14. Follow scaffold safe work procedure step by step.
